October 4, 1953 - February 25, 2003



Wendy L. Mills, the Production Manager for *Gonzaga Law Review*, was diagnosed with colon cancer in late December 2002. Sadly, it took her life on February 25, 2003.

Wendy, having worked with *Gonzaga Law Review* since 1992, was the backbone of *Gonzaga Law Review*. She formatted the articles, corrected the substantive and technical mistakes, and compiled every issue. Moreover, she did everything that needed to be done. Wendy was the bedrock upon which *Gonzaga Law Review* was rooted. She loved her work at *Gonzaga Law Review* and was the epitome of a dedicated individual.

Her illness did not sway her dedication to the law review. On February 17, 2003, Wendy asked her husband to bring her to the law review office to work. This was not only a holiday, but also three days before she was admitted to the hospital for surgery and just a week before she died. When Wendy arrived at the law school, she was in too much pain to walk up the stairs; she had to take the elevator, something she never did. Wendy insisted on coming to work because there were two articles she desperately wanted to complete. After finishing the first she was so weak Wendy thought she could not continue, but she forced herself to complete the second article.

Wendy faithfully carried out her duties, helped the law review members through their frustrations, and always completed the tasks that were necessary for the smooth operation of the publication. The mere dedication of a single volume is an understatement of what Wendy Mills meant to the law review. She has touched the lives of many and will be greatly missed.
